In the background of this story, little did Caesar Augustus know that his census was orchestrated by our one and only Sovereign God, to fulfill the prophecy of the Messiah's birth in Bethlehem (Micah 5:2). Because of this, Joseph and Mary left Nazareth and traveled to Bethlehem so they could be counted, for tax purposes, as being from the lineage of King David.

After the lamb's birth, the priestly shepherds would wrap the lambs in cloth and lay them in a manger lined with soft hay to prevent them from hurting themselves; because the Passover lambs had to be unblemished with no bruise or broken bones. Theologian, William Barclay wrote, "That there was no room in the inn was symbolic of what was to happen to Jesus. The only place where there was room for him was on a cross." WOW!!! It's heart breaking to see that creation made no room for its Creator!!! Lord help us!!!

And in the midst of all this, the Lord's angels, His Heavenly Hosts, bring good tidings of great joy. May we choose to join them in praising and saying, "Glory to God in the highest, and on earth peace, good will toward men!!!"

Wednesdays @ 6:30PM Live on: JCRS-SATX FB Page Hanukkah, aka, The Festival of Lights, is celebrated by our Jewish brothers & sisters. This year, Hanukkah begins at sundown on Thursday, December 7th and ends on the evening of Friday, December 15th.

Hanukkah means "dedication." In the 2nd Century, Israel was ruled by Seleucids (Syrian-Greeks) who tried to implement Greek culture instead of the Jewish beliefs and observances in God. But a small remnant of faithful, but poorly armed Jews, led by Judah the Maccabee, defeated one of the mightiest armies



on earth, at that time. Through God's help, they were able to drive out the Greeks from their land, reclaim the Holy Temple in Jerusalem, and rededicate it to God.

There was only one single cruse of olive oil left, which had not been contaminated by the Greeks, which was used to light the menorah. Miraculously it stayed lit for eight days; until new oil could be prepared, under the conditions of their ritual purity. This miracle of the one single cruse of oil that kept the menorah lit for eight days is celebrated as **Hanukkah**, **The Festival of Lights**.

Hanukkah restores and renews the light of hope, the spirit of giving thanks, and the love of Father God into the life and home of our Jewish brethren. The tradition of lighting the menorah over the eight days of Hanukkah represents a beautiful picture of how the Messiah truly lights every part of our souls and spirits, every day of our lives. God's mercies are new each day, and we can be blessed by seeing and experiencing His light being manifested throughout the Festival of Lights! Through this eight day celebration of lighting the menorah candles, we clearly see how God provides His miracle of light in the midst of trials and darkness. Praise Adonai!!!
